## Diksha leads home hopes at Women's Indian Open

**GURUGRAM:** Diksha Dagar, India's best ranked player on the Ladies European Tour (LET), will be the home hopes at the \$400,000 Hero Women's Indian Open starting at the DLF Golf and Country Club here on Thursday. Diksha, 22nd on the Order of Merit list, finished third in this event last year.

Switzerland's Chiara Tamburini, the LET OOM leader who has already won thrice this season, starts as the favourite at the challenge course. Belgium's Manon De Roey, second in that list, England's Alice Hewson and Amy Taylor, Perrine Delacour of France and Shannon Tan (Singapore) will also

be in contention among the 114-player field.

Others among the 26 Indians in the fray are Tvesa Malik, who won her first international title in South Africa this year, and the talented 19-year-old Hitaashee Bakshi, who heads the Women's Golf Associa-

tion of India (WGAI) OOM. Bakshi had equalled the course record here in March with an eight-under in the sixth leg of Hero Women's Pro Golf Tour (WPGT).

The course is expected to play firm and fast. "It's always a tough course to play. The secret is to take

one shot at a time. On courses like these, tee and approach shots become very important," Diksha said.

The deep-faced bunkers, undulating and narrow fairways, water hazards and sharp bends approaching several greens, choice of shots and accuracy off the tee will be crucial. "The conditions in Taiwan were very different. It was quite windy, which meant we were not getting the desired distances. Here, it will be difficult to control the putts because the greens are so fast," said Diksha.

### **Family woes, taekwondo**

Dagar, who finished T49 at the Paris Olympics, blamed the car accident involving her and her

parents in the French capital a week earlier for a below par showing.

"It did affect my rhythm. My mother had spine injuries and had to be hospitalised. My dad, who caddies for me, was thus not around to help me. On the brighter side, I now have a story to narrate for a few years," she joked.

With women players pushing the yardage, Dagar has realised the need to get fitter and stronger. She has started to lift heavier weights in the gym and is also taking taekwondo classes to build strength and endurance.

"The girls are hitting longer than ever and I felt the need to add power to my game to be able to do that. I started learning taekwondo only a few weeks back."

Diksha.

Thursday, with 114 players from 30 countries.

The vice president of Hero MotoCorp, Sanjay Bhan reiterated the commitment of the organisation to help the event and the sport grow.

Chiara Tamburlini, the highest ranked player at No.66, from Switzerland, Alice Hewson of England, Mannon De Roey of Belgium apart from the three Indian women Diksha, Tvesa and Hitaashee Bakshi, expressed their excitement about competing on the challenging course that called for perfect tee-shots and the ability to tackle the fast greens.

A high-quality 114-strong field from 31 countries including 27 home players will line up for the latest edition of the \$400,000 Hero Women's Indian Open at the DLF Golf and Country Club in Gurgaon with Ladies European Tour Order of Merit leader Chiara Tamburlini expected to be one of the leading acts.

The 24-year-old from Switzerland is in her first year on the LET and has already won thrice across three continents – Africa, Europe and most recently Asia – and can wrap up season's honours before flying out to Saudi Arabia for the Aramco Team series next week.

Besides Tamburlini, second-placed Manon De Roey of Belgium, Caroline Hedwall of Sweden), Lee-Anne Pace of South Africa) and Thailand's Trichat Cheenglab will be among the internationals to watch out for. The Indian challenge will feature two-time Olympian Diksha Dagar, only the second Indian to have won on the LET, upcoming star Pranavi Urs and the experienced Tvesa Malik Sandhu.

Currently ranked 66th in the world, Tamburlini said at the event launch on Tuesday that she was focussed on a good performances at the testing DLF course. "Yes, it is my goal to win the Order of Merit. But, in the end, all I can do is try and hit every shot as good as I can. I can't control what other people do.

## Course management and adapting to fast green key to Hero Indian Open Diksha

Talented golfer Diksha Dagar is keeping her expectations low this week, emphasising that course management and adapting to the fast greens here will be crucial as she leads the home challenge at the Hero Indian Open.

As many as 114 players from 31 nations, many of whom have been recent winners on the Ladies European Tour, will compete in the prestigious tournament beginning at the DLF Golf and Country Club on Thursday.

"The secret of doing well on this course is just enjoy every shot, like staying focused and not getting ahead in the game. I have been working on my skills, so now I am happy with my form right now," Diksha, who finished third in the LET Order of Merit in 2023, told PTI during an interaction.

"But this time I don't have any expectation from myself. I don't want to think about last year, and just go there, have fun and play."

The 23-year-old Indian, who previously finished tied third in last year's Indian Open and has represented India at the Tokyo and Paris Olympics, highlighted the importance of enjoying the game and maintaining focus.

"This course is very different, it is very unique, all aspects of the game are very challenging, so you have to plan it very well, the most important is course management."

"I'm going with a positive mindset and I am not going to think about last year, past is past. I'm working on important aspects of my game. Like on this course, tee shots, and around the greens. I'm working on the putting green also," Diksha said.

"This green is so fast this year. And when I chip around the green, the ball is not stopping. Last year I played well, performed well. This time also I will focus on my game."

Diksha, who has already won two LET titles, aims to add more power to her game and has been taking taekwondo classes to elevate her fitness.

"I need to gain some weight, to put the power on the ball. So I can get a good strength, so right now I have joined taekwondo three weeks back and I am also working on my the fitness," said Diksha, a gold medallist at the 2017 Deaflympics.
