Indian Open golf: Tan and Hewson share lead

Gurugram: Shannon Tan of Singapore and Alice Hewson of England were the only ones under par after 36 holes in the 2024 Hero Women's Indian Open at the demanding and superfast DLF Golf and Country Club.

Shannon (71-71), who gave up college golf after a year to turn professional, is the only one with two sub-par rounds. Both Hewson (72-70) and Shannon, who have one win each in 2024, survived rough finishes to stay in red numbers. While Shannon, a tenth tee starter bogeyed the seventh and the eighth, her 16th and 17th holes, Hewson, playing a group behind Tan, double bogeyed the eighth, her

17th hole, to be with the Singaporean on the perch. At 2-under 142 they were two ahead of four players, Perrine Delacour of France, Aussie Kirsten Rudgeley and the English duo Florentyna Parker and Hayley Davis, tied for third at even par.

The day's stellar performance came from India's Hitaashee Bakshi (80-68). The 20-year, who is leading the Hero WPGT Order of Merit in India, was staring at an early exit at 2-over after three holes in the second round after a first round 80. From 10-over she rallied with seven birdies against one bogey in last the 15 for a 68 and a swing of 12 shots between her two rounds. She leapt from overnight T-78 to T-16.

Home-favourite Hitaashee revives Indian hopes with a superb effort

Hitaashee Bakshi revived Indian hopes with four-under 68 on the second day of the \$400,000 Hero Women's Indian Open golf championship at the DLF Golf and Country Club on Friday.

It was a brilliant revival by one of the home favourites, after the 20-year-old Hitaashee had shot 12-over 80 in the opening round. The domestic Order of Merit leader, Hitaashee was overtaken by fellow Indians Pranavi Urs (joint 7th) and Ridhima Dilawari (joint 12th), as nine Indians made the cut, and qualified for the business end of the championship.

It was a commendable effort by the Indian players, as three-time champion this season and the hot favourite for the event, Chiara Tamburlini of Switzerland missed the cut by one shot, with an overall 11-over 155. She shot 9-over 81 this day. Amandeep Dral also missed the cut by one shot.

Diksha Dagar revived her fortunes with a par round while Mannat Brar, Vani Kapoor, Janneya Dasanniece, Ananya Garg and

Tvesa Malik also made the cut.

Shannon Tan of Singapore and Alice Hewson of England, two other players to achieve sub-par round on the day, led the field

with 2-under 142.

Pranavi was the best among the Indians as she wound up with 1-over 145. "Am only three shots away from the leaders. Should make less mistakes. Happy

with the way I played. The placement is very important in this course," said Pranavi, a regular on the Ladies European Tour (LET).

Overnight sole leader Sara Kouskova of the Czech Republic slipped to the 11th spot, as she had a 5-over 77 for the day, for an overall 2-over 146.

Ridhima was the most consistent among the Indians, with rounds of 74 and 73. She explained that she was good at playing par in any course.

She said that it was important not to get angry with one's mistakes, as it was par for the tough course!

"Yesterday I started slow. I started with three bogeys, but DLF is such a course that you can go five under, and you can also go five over. So, I think you just have to be patient, which I was yesterday, for a two-over.



"Today I started off pretty good, and I think I was just consistent. I'm happy with the one-under. I think my putting has been good both days. I think my pace has been very good on the golf course, which really helps with greens like this."

On her plans for the third round, the 21-year-old from Mysuru, who is 27th on the Order of Merit, said, "Tomorrow I'll not be aggressive, but try just sticking to the plan and trying to hit as many regulations as possible. And, hopefully it goes well."

Bakshi had opened the event with an unexpected 8 over 80 on Thursday but bounced back strongly on the second day even as pre-event favourite and LET Order of Merit leader Chiara Tamburlini of Switzerland continued to struggle on the firm DLF greens to card a 9 over 81 on Friday after opening with

a 74 on Thursday.

Hitaashee said, "After I finished my round one, I had a quick chat with my coach. We discussed a couple of things. We were pretty set what I had to do today. We didn't really do anything fancy. We just wanted to keep it simple - one shot at a time.

"I think that was the most important thing for me because I started off with a bogey, then second was a par but then third again was a bogey and all I could think of was just do not give up till the time you hit the last putt on the 18th. So, we just kept on playing one shot at a time."

Tamburlini had travelled to Delhi with her season's third title in Taiwan but could only return a card on Friday that included a triple bogey, three double bogeys and three bogeys against two birdies.

The treacherous greens of the DLF Golf and Country Club continued to test the field for the second successive day at the Hero Women's Indian Open (HWIO) with overnight leader Sara Kouskova dropping to 11th place and Ladies European Tour (LET) Order of Merit (OOM) leader Chiara Tamburlini missing the cut on Friday.

With greens playing faster than ever before -- vouched for by stunned course regulars -- only nine in the 114-strong field could card under-par scores while only six managed to make par. Australia's Kirsten Rudgeley's even par round (72-72) propelled her from an overnight T8 to a shared third spot.

The cut fell at an unprecedented 10-over 154 as nine Indians went through to the weekend, including two-time LET winner Diksha Dagar (78-72, T24) and amateurs Mannat Brar (76-75, T35) and Janneya Dasanniee (76-77, T-49). DLF duo of Vani Kapoor (75-77, T-45) and Tvesa Malik (77-77, T-60) also made it to the money rounds.

Singapore's Shannon Tan (71-71) rose from overnight fifth place to the top, sharing the spot with England's Alice Hewson (72-70) who was eighth when the play began under the typically nippy and hazy conditions.

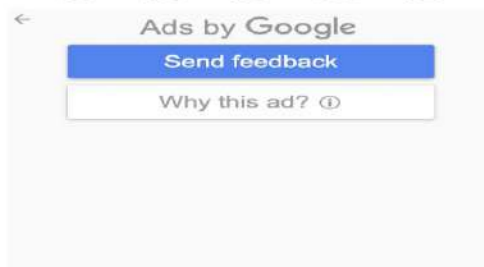

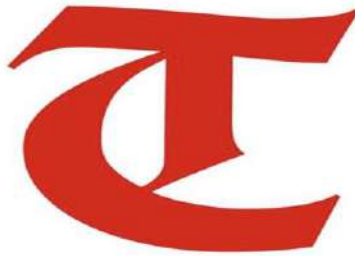
